### Dunfermline Abbey & Palace

Visit Dunfermline Palace and Abbey, the remains of a great Benedictine abbey founded by Queen Margaret in the 11th century. Substantial parts of the abbey buildings remain, including the vast refectory. The foundations of Queen Margaret's church are under the present superb nave, built in the 12th century in the Romanesque style.



### Andrew Carnegie Birthplace Museum

Stop to visit the Andrew Carnegie Birthplace Museum, dedicated to the life of the Scottish-American Industrialist who led the expansion of the Steel Industry in the 19th century. The biographical museum preserves the 18th-century weaver's cottage where Carnegie was born in 1835, detailing his journey from humble beginnings to becoming one of the wealthiest people in the world.



### Pittencrieff House

Visit Pittencrieff House, a 17th-century laird's house renowned as the birthplace of General John Forbes, and later purchased and gifted to the town by philanthropist Andrew Carnegie in 1903. Today, the site serves as a center for local heritage, art and natural history.
